This quarter's house kudos are extended to the home of Sarah and Tyson Schwiesow, 1040 South VanBuren. The house was originally built in 1921 for Mrs. Agnes Jorgenson, widow of Mr. John L. Jorgenson, owner of a dry goods store. Three other owners have lived there, most recently Barbara Lawton, the current Lieutenant Governor of Wisconsin resided there. The Schwiesow's have lived in there since 2003.

Over the past seven years the Schweisows have undertaken several major projects. They have tried to keep the designs simple and true to the original style of the house, described as Prairie-style with Mediterranean influences. A mixture of new and old materials have been incorporated, including an old sink that was found curbside elsewhere in the neighborhood!

On the inside, their kitchen renovation was one of their first major projects. Appliances and lighting were updated. Extensive new cabinetry was built locally, all from quarter-sawn oak. The rich wood stains complement the existing hardwood floor and blend harmoniously with their collection of Craftsman-style furniture found throughout the house. Deco stained glass panes are a decorative motif.

The basement was renovated in the past year. The vision was to make the space more livable and easy to use. To that end, an exterior entrance was added to the west wall with a Bilko door and wide staircase to allow easy access for large furniture. The floors were sealed with an epoxy and walls, ceiling and exposed mechanicals (i.e. pipes and electrical conduits) were all painted. The ceiling was left open to allow for easy maintenance. Several lightly stained maple cabinets were put in.

The original exterior of the house is brick and the roof is a combination of rolled rubber on flat portions and Ludowici green tile on sloped areas. Complementary to these features, flagstone walkways have been added, along with a fire pit and play area for their children.

When asked what she likes about living in Astor Park, Sarah begins by talking about the trees, the people, and the variety and beauty of the homes. She describes it as a self-sufficient place to live. It is within walking distance or very close to retail, work, school, restaurants, parks, and recreation. Her family uses the Fox River Trail nearly daily spring through fall and occasionally during the winter. This is truly an exceptional house in our neighborhood.
