President's Message

Summer is in full swing and we hope you are enjoying yours. The City Band concerts have been successful and the weather has cooperated beautifully, so far. Movie nights at St. James have been set and we hope to see you all out there enjoying this rare pleasure!

Phase III of the Bellin Health Campus Redevelopment project is well in progress. The Courtyard Building will house The Laird Welcome Center; a new hospital front entrance; Bellin Health Retail Pharmacy; The Bellin Gift Shoppe; Backstreet Espresso; Family and Community Resource Center; Marguerite L. Kress Birthing Center; Medical Unit; Mary Ellen and Karl Kuehne Imaging Center and Woman's Services; and an in-house pharmacy.

The Green Bay Water Utility Ashwaubenon Transmission Main project continues Phase D with work affecting Lawe Street from about the East River to Irwin; Irwin from Lawe to Grignon; and Grignon from Irwin to Fox River, where the underwater phase begins. The estimated completion date for Phase D is December 2, 2005.

Finally, St. Vincent Hospital has begun their surface parking project on the parcels separating the two surface lots on South Van Buren. Tree removal, clearing, electric installation, paving and striping should be complete by the end of July. Lighting has an estimated completion date of mid August.

Along with all the home improvements going on throughout Astor, there is a great deal of construction. Please use care when traveling around these construction sites and have a safe summer!

Summertime Pet Tips

While we hope that you are enjoying the warm weather of the summertime, we wanted to remind you of a couple of important city ordinances to help your pets enjoy the weather, as well.

First, all dogs and cats must have a license, available for 5\$ at the City Treasurers office. Each year, these need to renewed by March 31st.

Per 8.06 (1), no animals shall be permitted to be at large within the City. Suggestions for keeping pets outside include crating, penning, leashing, or personal supervision of the animals.

Except in cases of a recent litter, 8.08 (3) indicates that no family shall have more than two dogs and 8.09 (3) limits the home to three cats on a residential lot without specific permission or a waiver from the city. Additionally, 8.08 (6) states that loud and persistent barking is prohibited.

Finally, we respectfully request that all neighborhood pet owners follow 8.04 section 5, requiring the removal of animal waste products. Please "doo" your part to keep our neighborhood beautiful!

Hazelwood House Events

This summer there several entertaining events at our neighborhood's Hazelwood House. On August 6^{th} and 7^{th} , there is a Summer Fair, which will feature demonstrations and vintage crafts available for purchase. There will be an ice-cream social, as well as other food available for purchase. The fair runs from 10-4, and entry is the regular admission fee.

On September 14th and 15th, there will be the popular "If Tombstones Could Talk" program at the Woodlawn Cemetery. Members of the Heritage Players will portray the men and women who are buried there. Admission to this program is \$4 per person, \$10 per family.
