President's Message

I would like to thank all of you who attended our neighborhood's annual meeting in March. We discussed numerous issues at this meeting and I am sure you will agree with me that it was positive and exciting for the neighbors of Astor.

Changes abound for Astor

This summer you will begin to notice the first of many changes that will impact our neighborhood. The St. James Park band shell is nearing completion and will host city band concerts this summer. This is an exciting addition to our neighborhood and a perfect venue for hosting special events for the residents of Green Bay. In this newsletter, please note the celebrations planned to dedicate this new structure and celebrate the 100th anniversary of the city band – the oldest in the United States! I hope that you can attend both.

You will notice road construction along Monroe Avenue early this summer as the city reconfigures the Monroe Street exit ramp at Mason Street. The new ramp will provide both a north and south exit from Mason Street: we are hopeful that this new configuration will slow traffic along Monroe. Look for the new Astor Neighborhood Sign just south of the ramp, once construction is complete. You will actually notice similar signs throughout the city as all seven neighborhood associations are using grant money to design and build neighborhood identification signs.

If you have ever driven down Olde Main Street in Green Bay or Broadway Street in DePere, you have probably noticed street signs that do no look like the standard green and white signs that mark all other streets. The Astor Neighborhood Association received a grant to assist with the purchase and installation of decorative street signs. The signs, which will most likely be brown with white lettering and will display our official Astor Neighborhood Association logo, will designate all streets within our neighborhood association

boundaries. They will be a perfect compliment to this historical part of Green Bay.

House Kudos

The Kainers – Larry,
Nora, and their son
John – live in the
Italianesque home at
621 Eliza Street. The
couple purchased the
three-bedroom, one den

house in August of 1999, and they have been busy ever since.

Larry has restored ninety percent of the woodwork in the house, including the staircase to the second floor and all of the wood around it. Most of the wood was painted so Larry had to strip it first. The crown molding in the upstairs den consists of fifty-plus pieces, which Larry is in the midst of putting back together.

On the inside, all of the floors have been, or are in the process of being, restored; the den was gutted and redone; the largest bedroom was recently plastered and painted; and Larry installed three new windows (with grills to match) in the walk-up attic. He plans to attack the bathroom and kitchen when he returns to working on the inside.

The yard is on the small side so the landscaping has been limited. Larry may replace the driveway with paving stone. He re-roofed, painted the inside of, and placed a new door on the garage. Larry replastered the outside lower level of the house; he plans to do the upper level this summer and then paint the house.

Larry rebuilt the front porch, which you may not notice since it looks just like it used to. He also replaced one of the exterior doors with a solid wood core hemlock door.

Of interest is the old-style floor plan with its wagon-wheel landing at the top of the stairs: the rooms upstairs border a circular hallway instead of a linear one.

Astor Beat Cops

Officers Mike Hansford and Terry Tyler have participated in several activities and events in the Green Bay Area recently. Officer Hansford arranged for approximately thirty kids to attend the circus on March 2, 2002 with circus tickets donated by the Shrine Circus and the Shriners of Northeast Wisconsin. Children from almost all of the schools in this Community Police Area accompanied Officer Hansford.

Officer Tyler participated in Cops-N-Lobsters at the Ashwaubenon Red Lobster. The event had Officers from the Green Bay area waiting on tables and 'trying' to take orders –Terry mainly served glasses of water and chatted with patrons. All funds went to the Special Olympics.
