## 4. Announcements and Committee Reports

a. Officer Van Handel & HOPE Committee Discussion: Power Point presentation (Pastor Schleis has a copy). Officer Van Handel started with a history of downtown issues, including homelessness. St. John the Evangelist does house a number of the homeless, but in the evening. Homeless there now in the 70s. The police dept., in financial and manpower costs, would be in favor of a daytime shelter.

Lutheran Social Services (LSS) (Jane, Wellspring) was invited in, to help with daytime, M-Fri, 9-5:30/ Sun. Noon-4 PM. adult drop-in centers. Proposed: New Visions Resource Center, with community involvement and support. Need to be within walking distance of downtown resources. LSS now working to secure a grant.

David then presented the proposed location: 600 S. Adams/100 E. Mason. Presently owned by Bob Vanderkelen (sp.?). Bellin parking lot nearby. Would need to update and beautify the location. Initial to rent, possibly to own. ANA members mentioned past problems with trying to sell/lease that location. Questions asked about neighborhood/family safety concerns, as these individuals would now be drawn into our Astor Neighborhood/Howe School/Fox River trail area (some people fishing there, intoxication issues). LSS: a lot of self-discipline, and would call police if needed. Plans the next 30 days = meet with ANA board, meet with Mayor Schmidt, secure permits and lease, secure financial resources.

- c. Newsletter (Kevin): questions about an email about the online newsletter. We will still need a mailed newsletter, 4 per year for the Neighborhood grant.
